Presidents Report



Help Needed...

"He that hath a Trade, hath an Estate." - Benjamin Franklin

The lack of skilled tradespeople is becoming a major problem in our country. According to information gathered by economists and trade unions, by 2025 approximately 3.5 million trade jobs will need to be filled (1.0 million due to expansion and 2.5 million due to the retirement of baby

boomers). It is expected that almost 2 million of these jobs will go unfilled.

Sherrie L. Vossler, adjunct associate professor of electrical technology at Lansing Community College (LCC) said, "It's important that kids and their parents know about the skilled trades programs available, and these aren't the kinds of jobs that get outsourced the way other jobs can. Not only that, but workers in skilled trades have at least one key advantage over their white-collar counterparts: The nature of these jobs and their requirements are clearly defined, so the ability to pick up and move to new work can be an attractive feature when job markets are tight otherwise."

Many students have been told that "Vo-Tech is for dumb kids or washouts". This has contributed to the image that trade schools have been dealing with for many years. I can tell you from personal experience that when I was attending classes at Camden County Vocational & Technical School (in the early 1970's) the stereotype was that we were the less intelligent kids who couldn't hack "regular" school. That is, we were less intelligent, or troublemakers, or just wanted to get out of testing. I am not saying that every student in every high school felt that way...but that has been the stereotype for many years.

Here is something to think about and I am confident that we have all heard this before. You are walking by a janitor or a job site with your parent says: *"that's why you need to study...So you don't end up like him."* What do they mean by that? Do they mean that their job is not as important as other work? That you should study and go to college, so you do not have such a menial job like that.

Think about this... "that guy" could be making more money than you are, and he might be happy working outside and with his hands all day. He might be providing well for his family and have a great work-life balance.

Presidents Report (Continued)

When the culture talks like that, it produces a bias against the trades in the minds of our youth. It carries all sorts of implied messages that some jobs are less important than others, or that anyone who holds that type of job is less intelligent, or less hard working, or less ambitious. Nothing could be further from the truth.

From the time we started attending school, we have been told that you must go to college to be successful. It is true that many college graduates make more money than those who do not...but less than 50% of the students finish the degrees that they started. Going to college is not a guarantee of a successful future if you are not given the proper support to complete the degree.

Upon graduation, the average college student enters the working world with over \$80,000 in debt. Consider that those who work in the trades have been making between \$30,000 - \$60,000 per year while those other students have been accumulating debt during the same time frame. If students were properly explained the possibilities that a vocational education can offer, that might help students and their parents see many paths to a successful future.

So how do we solve this problem? Well, Pro Tool Reviews has several suggestions we should all consider:

1. Encourage communication and education about the trades to young adults, particularly at the middle school levels. This really needs to occur before 9th grade when kids begin locking in plans to attend college.
2. Spread the news to your friends and family. With the current deficit of workers, being a tradesman can help young people quickly earn decent money for a job well done.
3. Educate young people on the true cost of college. College is for some—not everyone. On the job training and trade schools, however, typically cost far less than a typical college degree. That even goes for state schools.
4. Hire young people and prepare your own company to educate and grow job skills. You must walk the walk if you want the industry to change. Prepare your company for the patience, training, and programs required to encourage young people in the skilled trades.

Legislative News

Luis Crespo, Sr.—Chapter VP-Legislative



Welcome back to the monthly ASPE South Florida Chapter Newsletter for April. This is the time of year when the showers of April sprout upon the beautiful skies of South Florida, getting ready for the May flowers. So in speaking of water this month, I want to talk about how water can affect us and harm us as it gives us life. I am talking about the Legionella in the water supply.

In this month's topic, I want to discuss this Legionella among the others like:

- Mycobacterium (m. avium, M. chimaera)
- Pseudomonas aeruginosa
- Acinetobacter baumannii
- Aeromonas hydrophila
- And many others with so many to mention.

The Legionella bacteria accrue in building water systems and are parasitic to other organisms, higher life forms. On a water system pipe wall, a biofilm deposit will develop consisting of many types of bacteria. When that community of microorganisms is diverse enough, higher life forms will grace upon the biofilm for nutrients. Like amoeba grace on the biofilm, the protozoan cell has no problem with any of the bacteria as a food source, except for Legionella. When they encounter Legionella, the bacteria infect the amoeba, and instead of being consumed as a nutrient, the bacteria grow inside the amoeba. They will grow to a vast number very quickly and within 24 hours or 48 hours or even less in some cases. The Legionella are packed. The amoeba loses control, and the cell lysis releases thousands of viable Legionella into the system that are now hunting for a new host to infect.

Where in building water system the bacteria of Legionella can be found on surfaces inside premise plumbing. This means it is inside all the tubing plumbing piping in a building water system. In the faucet system and showerheads, especially in electronic auto faucets and in most fixtures that are not used. So let us think about the water storage tanks that are not properly maintained. We ask ourselves, how about the storage tank I have in my house and when the COVID-19 pandemic began. Those storage tanks that haven't been used in hotels, restaurants, and resorts, what if they are infected.

If water conditioners and softeners are not properly maintained, they will harbor Legionella bacteria. A spa and hot tubs are a very important source of exposure. If they are not maintained properly, they will become heavily colonized with Legionella. Pools, humidifiers, water fountains are another source; everyone has heard about cooling towers; if not maintained, Legionella will proliferate.

These are food for thought. We do not have any code to control the Legionella, but it is up to each individual building to minimize risk and liability. How will COVID-19 and Legionella, if combined in a host, affect the immune system? We ask; one is in the air and the other in the water. These are the thing for the future scientist and the new generation to deal with...God help us all.

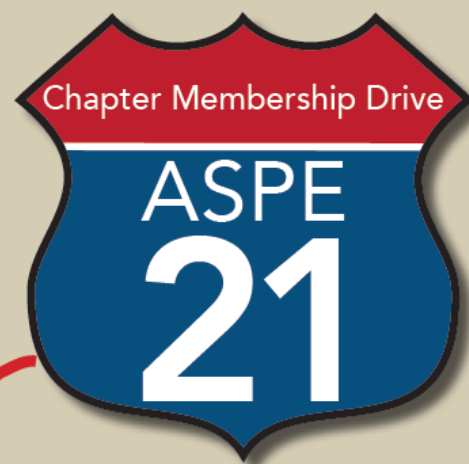

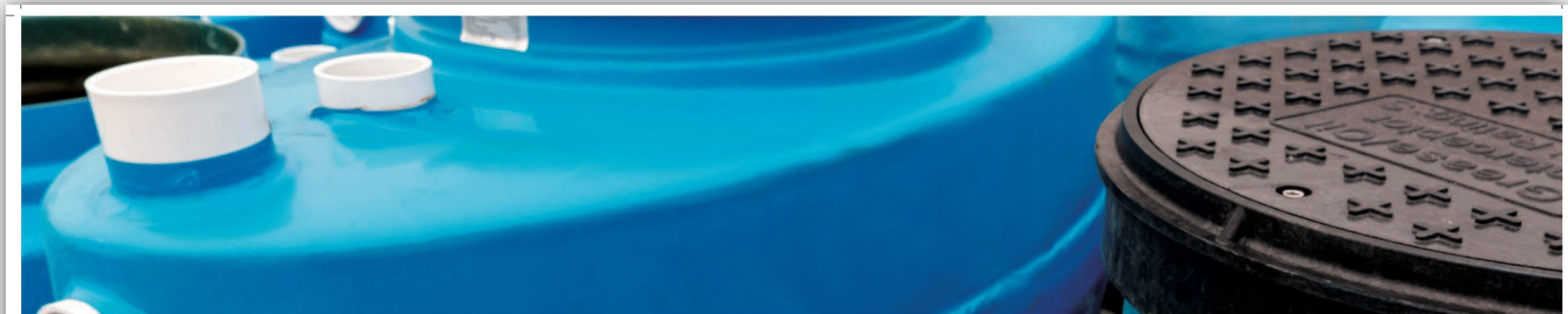

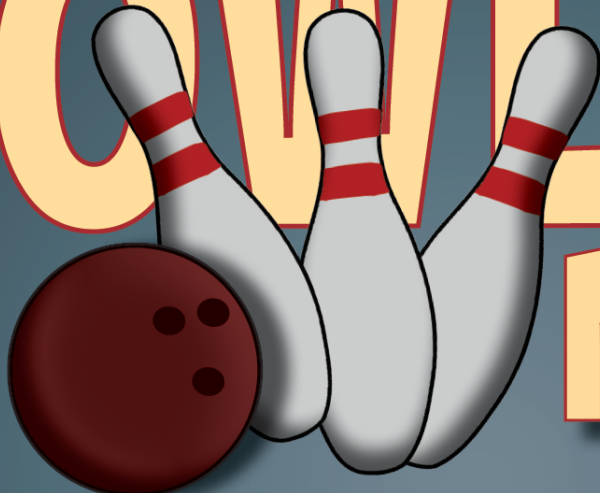
Scott Smith—Affiliate Liaison

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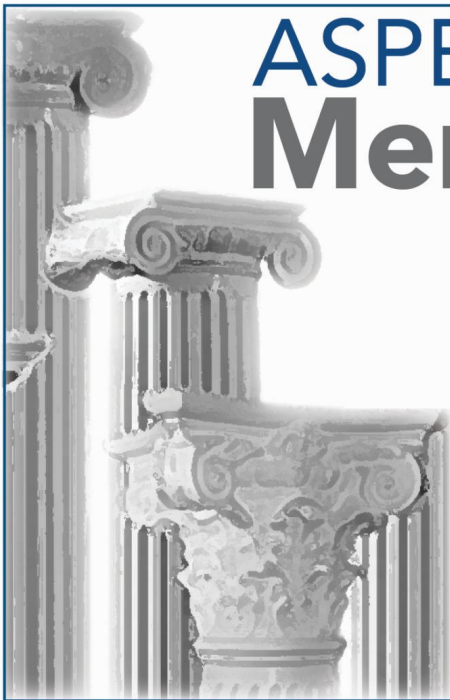
