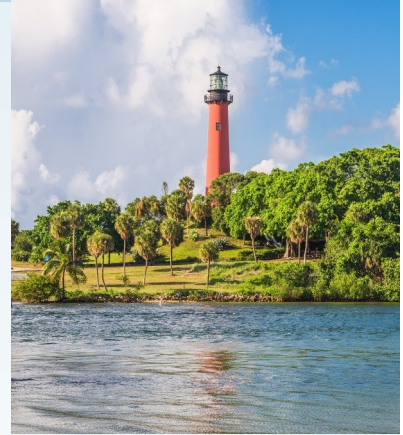

Legislative News

Luis Crespo, Sr.—Chapter VP-Legislative



Welcome back to the monthly ASPE South Florida Chapter Newsletter for May. As the showers start in, the flowers will bloom soon. I hope everyone has been healthy and staying SAFE. With all that said, it brings me to this month's topic, which is Safe Harbors in the Fair Housing Act.

The United States Department of Housing and Urban Development recognized ten Safe Harbors for compliance with the Fair Housing Act. Those Safe Harbors have had five more added to them. Now is a total of fifteen, with the eleventh one being the ICC/ANSI A117.1 – 2009 following the International Building Code 2009, International Building Code 2012, International Building Code 2015, and International Building Code 2018. EFFECTIVE DATE: March 8, 2021, also see 24 CFR Part 100 [Docket No. FR-6138-F-02] RIN 2529-AA99 of Adoption of Additional Safe Harbors

The Accessible and Usable Buildings and Facilities standard is a technical standard for designing facilities that are accessible to persons with disabilities. Builders and developers may choose to depart from these guidelines and seek alternative ways to demonstrate that they have met the requirements of the Fair Housing Act. The standards employed must meet all of the design and construction requirements specified in the Fair Housing Act and HUD's Fair Housing regulations and provide the same or a stricter degree of Accessibility than the recognized Safe Harbors. The Architect has to decide what they can use legally to design and be comfortable using the Safe Harbor.

The laws that they cover are:

- Federal Disability Rights Laws - This guide provides an overview of Federal civil rights laws that ensure equal opportunity for people with disabilities.
- Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) - The Americans with Disabilities Act, Titles II and III, may apply to housing. Title II applies to the activities of state and local governments, including housing. Title III applies to places of public accommodation, such as rental and sales offices.
- ADA Standards for Accessible Design-The ADA Standards for accessible design are the accessibility standards adopted by the Department of Justice for compliance with Title III of the ADA.

Legislative News (Continued)

- Architectural Barriers Act of 1968 - The Architectural Barriers Act is a general accessibility law that requires buildings owned, leased, or operated by the federal government and those financed by a grant or loan from the federal government to be accessible. The accessibility standards used under the Architectural Barriers Act are UFAS.
- Fair Housing Act (as amended) - Congress passed the Fair Housing Amendments Act on September 13, 1988, extending coverage of Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (the Fair Housing Act) to prohibit discriminatory housing practices based on disability and family status. The Fair Housing Act also prohibits discrimination in the sale, rental, and financing of dwellings based on race, color, religion, sex, and national origin. The Fair Housing Act establishes seven design and construction requirements for all covered multifamily dwellings consisting of four or more units designed and constructed for first occupancy on or after March 13, 1991.
- Fair Housing Act Regulations - After Congress passed the Fair Housing Act, the Department of Housing and Urban Development adopted extensive regulations that describe in more detail the various forms of housing discrimination covered in the law. The sections of the regulations that address design and construction issues are 24 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 100.205, and some definitions are found in Section 24 CFR 100.201. Other portions of the regulations that deal with disability issues are in 24 CFR 100.201-.203. In general, HUD's regulations implementing the Fair Housing Act have the same effect as a law does.
- Section 504 of the 1973 Rehabilitation Act - Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act bars recipients of federal funds from discriminating on the basis of disability. Specifically, Section 504, which is enforced by HUD, prohibits its recipients of federal funds from discriminating based on disability. For recipients of funding from HUD, this includes the requirement that in new construction and substantial alterations, at least 5% of the housing units are accessible to people with mobility impairments, and at least 2% of the housing units are accessible to people with vision or hearing impairments. In addition, Section 504 requires recipients to make reasonable accommodations, including structural changes, so that people with disabilities can use and enjoy housing. Section 504 covers all of the programs and activities of a recipient of federal financial assistance and has additional requirements beyond those described here.

- Uniform Federal Accessibility Standards (UFAS) - The Uniform Federal Accessibility Standards, or UFAS, are the accessibility standards that have been adopted by various federal agencies, including the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), and are applicable to housing funded by HUD.

The majority of the project that I see coming in either uses the Accessibility Guidelines or the Fair Housing Act Design Manual. They are the two most common design parameters that are used, which are prevalent to others. If the Fair housing Accessibility Guideline is used to design the dwelling units, then the common area must comply with ANSI-117-1986 because that is referenced in the guidelines. Once a standard is used for the design, it has to abide only by that standard.

The design and construction requirements of the Fair Housing Act apply to all new multifamily housing consisting of four or more dwelling units. Such buildings must meet specific design requirements, so public and common use spaces and facilities are accessible to people with disabilities. In addition, the interior of dwelling units covered by the Fair Housing Act must be designed so they, too, meet certain accessibility requirements.

The Florida Accessibility Guidelines are located in the Florida Accessibility Code for Building Construction. I will cover more on this in my newsletters to come.

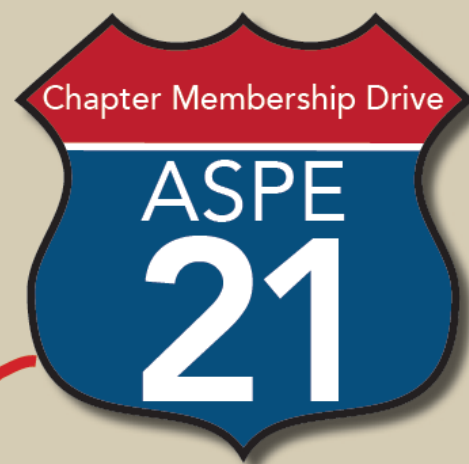

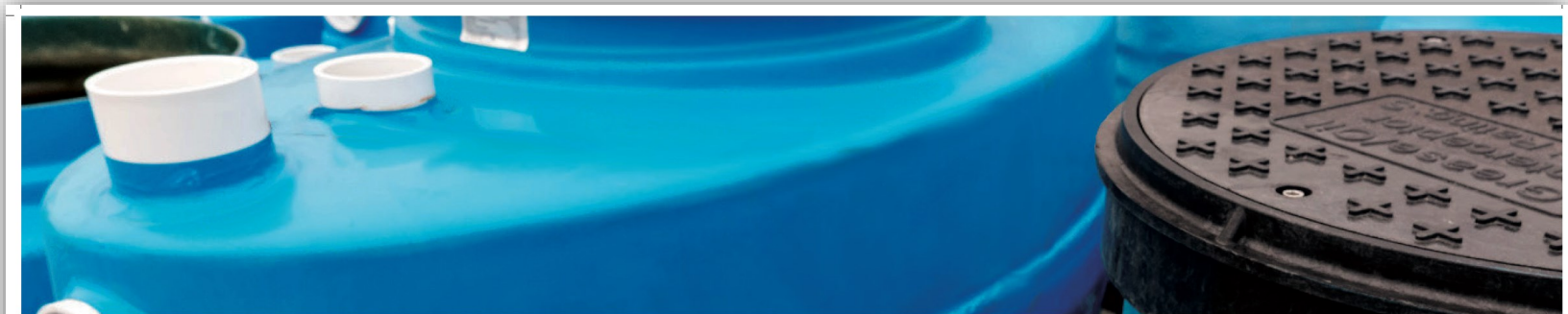

Affiliate Report

Scott Smith—Affiliate Liaison



I want to take this time to remind everyone about our June meeting, which will be the Bowling Tournament and Tabletop show. The success of our chapter requires the support of all members...without your support we cannot grow. Hope to see many of you there.

One of my responsibilities as the chapter Affiliate Liaison, as well as being an ASPE member, is to help educate our members. With that being said, I would like to discuss roof drains. When we look at roof drains we need to remember three things: Cause, Affect, Result

Springtime in South Florida is nothing short of amazing. The temperatures are mild, the sun shines brightly and the winds gently blow. Right around the corner, coming sooner than most would hope, are the sometimes brutally hot temperatures and the unbelievable strong downpours of rain. Many other cities around the US will be experiencing similar conditions as they transition from Winter to Spring and then to Summer.

As much as the rainfall provides for life on this planet, it can be devastating and has caused many catastrophes and roof collapses. If we are observant and smart, we can learn and gain knowledge from these catastrophes. The affect is a better understanding so we can provide codes, standards and methods to prevent them from happening again.

The result of understanding the causes and affects show up as new processes, procedures, and innovative products. As we grow and learn, these products get tested in new ways, redesigned to be easier or faster to install, more appealing, less conspicuous, more efficient. The style of today's standard cast iron roof drain has roughly been around since 1962 with no great improvements or advances.

We have learned the primary drain can get clogged and an emergency overflow drain is required but other than that, no major design improvements have been done. All that has changed. The requirement of providing the GPM capacity of the roof drain has sparked another innovative leap in design. A major drain manufacturer in the United States informed me that since they needed to test their roof drain for accurate capacity flows, they might as well review the design and make some improvements.

Their quest to find the most efficient design improvements have resulted in a roof drain that accomplished the goal of getting the water from the roof, down the drain as quickly as possible. Their quest to find the most efficient design improvements have resulted in a roof drain that accomplished the goal of getting the water from the roof, down the drain as quickly as possible. What were some of the barriers to that in the past?

- First, the water as it approached the drain had to hurdle the clamp collar or gravel guard.
- Second, after hurdling the clamp collar, it slammed into the flat surface of the dome slowing its entry into the bowl of the drain.
- Third, once it entered the bowl or sump of the drain and began to flow around it would collide with the bosses used to bolt the clamp collar to the body.

These obstructions did not allow the water to smoothly enter and exit the drain. What did the manufacturer do? They redesigned the clamp collar, so it was flat and added pyramid type lugs to direct the flow of water into the center of the drain and minimize the water from hitting the dome.

The dome was also redesigned to have less surface area allowing the water to flow through. The connections for the clamp collar to the body were moved to the outside of the body instead of being in the path of the water. The most obvious design improvement is the body. Shocker alert, a smooth funnel shape flows water better than a body with a sump (insert sarcastic emoji).

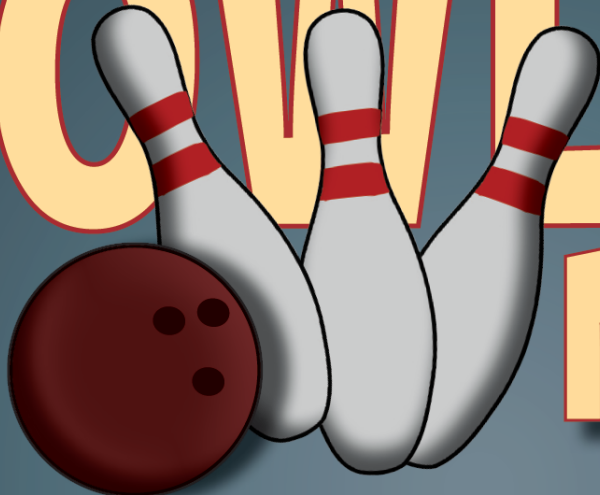
The result of these innovations is a roof drain that flows double the GPM as today's standard roof drain. DOUBLE. Think about what that means.

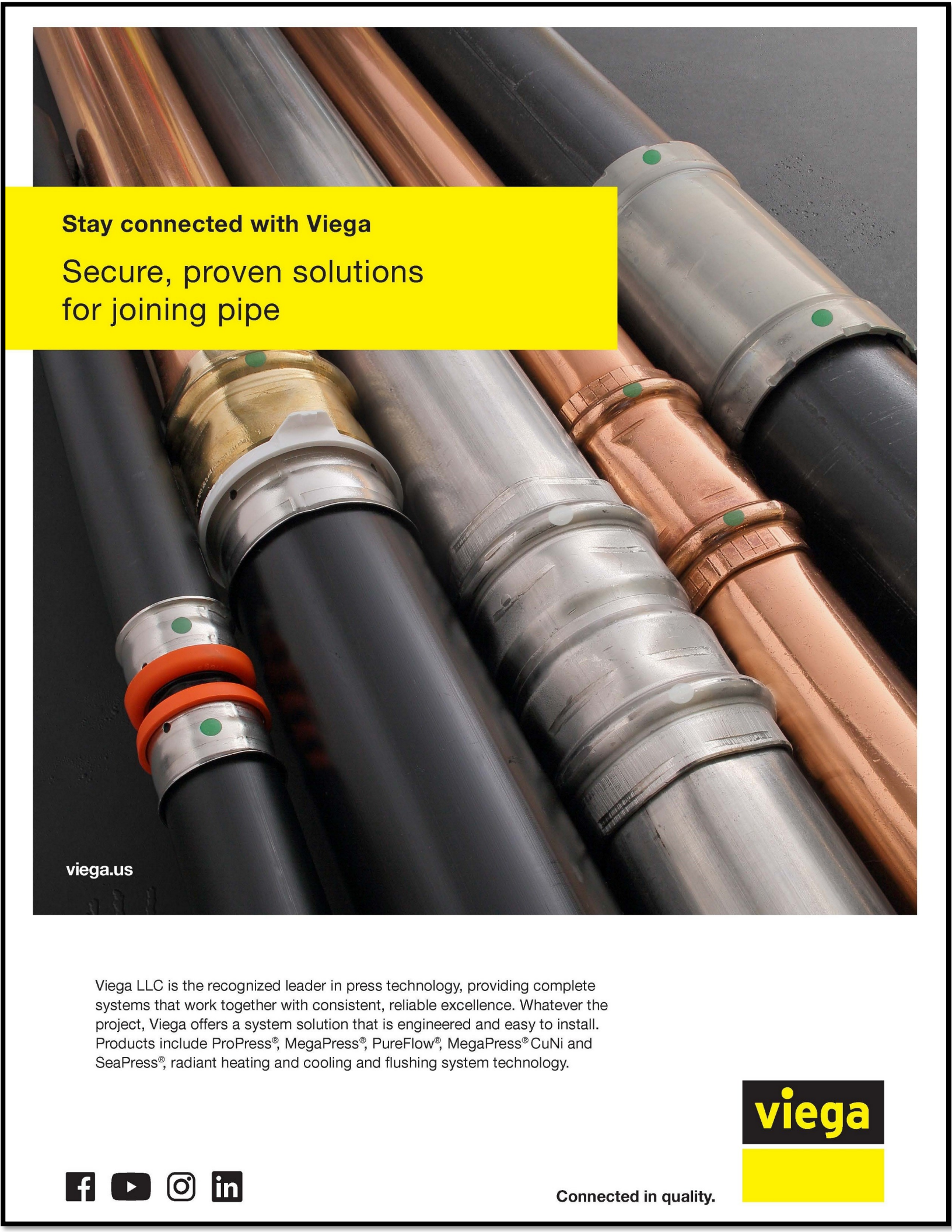

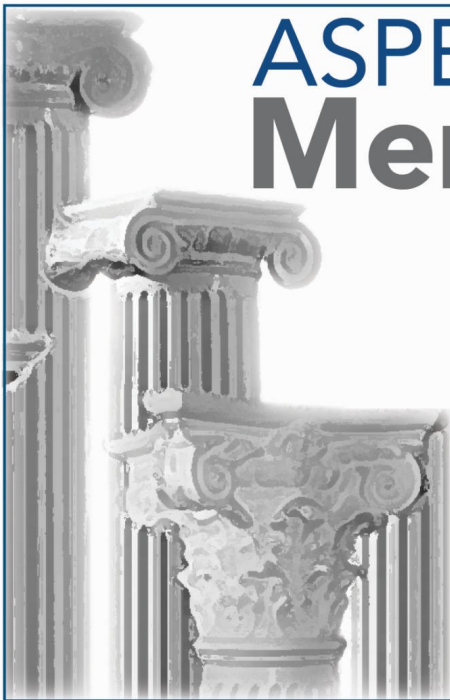
